A Note from the Pastor

Jesus returned from the Jordan River full of the Holy Spirit, and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness. There he was tempted for forty days by the devil. He ate nothing during those days and afterward Jesus was starving. Luke 4: 1-2

This year during Lent our focus will be on healing. I am using a book by Walter T. Wilson called *Healing in the Gospel of Matthew: Reflections on Method and Ministry*, and thus focusing on Matthew's Gospel rather than exactly following the lectionary. We will be talking about brokenness, and, of course, healing from brokenness. The main metaphor is shards of beach glass. Our first service in Lent will be, as always, an Ash Wednesday service. Because we still cannot meet in person, the service will be on Facebook. It will be live at 1:30, but will be available any time after that. We have been warned not to send out ashes to the congregation because some people will mistakenly add water to them which creates a caustic substance that can cause burns. To avoid that, we will be focusing on the elements: earth, fire, water and air. To fully participate, you will need some dirt or sand, a candle and a match or lighter and a small container of water. I hope this season will indeed be a season of healing and restoration for us all.

We need some volunteers! I would like suggestions for someone who can chair the Finance committee next year. The person will be trained to read the finance reports created by the treasurer and report to the monthly Administrative Council. I would like to have a volunteer sooner rather than later so training will be complete before January 2022. We also have a wonderful tech team, but we need four more people to complete the roster. We have volunteers of all ages from twenty-something to retired persons. I would love to have some teen volunteers, so if you or anyone you know (any age) can volunteer about two hours per month, please let me know. Rev. Alice Oberg has joined the Creative Design team. They set up the altar area to reflect the theme of our worship series. Thank you Pastor Alice.
