He was a bit of a highbrow and uninterested in people with less intelligence, but that, I suppose, is beside the point.) The poem claimed that it was cruel to give people hope, but I so disagree. For those of us living in southern California, the signs of spring appear in February rather than April, and I find the flowers very cheery and hopeful. Our worship series this Lent has reminded us more than once that it feels this year as if Lent has been a year-long. I am very much looking forward to the celebration of Easter.

I have been taking an online class called "Teaching Biblical Faith to Youth." I will be finished with the class on Friday, February 26. It has been fun learning what all you who are teachers already know about learning styles and keeping young people engaged. But it has made me quite anxious to get a youth group going. Cheyann Mitchell has asked to start a garden as a youth group project. Perhaps we could raise vegetables to provide food to people with food insecurity. Perhaps we could raise food to sell at church to raise money for a youth adventure. I don't have a complete plan, because I need the young people to invest in that decision. But gardening is a good plan because the work will be outdoors so we will maintain a good level of safety.

That said, I would love to hear from the youth. Who is interested in getting started? What ages and or grade levels will be able to meet? What day(s) are the youth available to meet? I would like to gather that information before setting a date, but I also think our gardening project should get started soon. Please have interested youth call or text me.
