A Note from the Pastor

He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God.

Micah 6: 8

If you are like me, your emotions have been on a virtual rollercoaster this month. Like most of the nation, I was frightened, shocked and appalled by the violence of the attack on the US Capital by insurrectionists on January 6. I was relieved and pleased by the peaceful transition of power exactly two weeks later. And I doubt that many of us, no matter our political leanings, remained dry-eyed while hearing Amanda Gorman's moving poem, The Hill We Climb, which calls us to seek a better nation. "The norms and notions of what just is / isn't always justice." Wow. We are called every day to make our world a better place, to seek light and justice for all. We have a lot of work to do; a lot of healing. The first step toward healing is loving, and the next step is really listening. Bishop Carcaño warned us of possible attacks on "liberal churches" on January 17, especially those in state capitals. When there were none, she was at first relieved. But while checking social media, she saw the guestion, "Why target churches?" and she pondered that. She hoped to hear the response "that churches are targeted because we have stood for everything that White Supremacists stand against – racial inclusion, racial equity, religious diversity, immigrant rights, refugee resettlement, restorative justice..." but when no answer was forthcoming, she had to lament that "we the Church have not raised our voice sufficiently to be heard." (Message from the Bishop, January 17, 2021.) I am very glad the church was not violently attacked, but it makes me wonder: have I—have we—raised our voices against racial oppression, white supremacy, restorative justice and all the ills that plague our country? In a conversation I had with Rabbi Jonathan Klein of Bakersfield Temple Beth El, my passions for doing justice include racial justice and immigrant rights. What are yours? Are we the church speaking loudly enough to "get in good trouble?" (a la John Lewis).

As glad as I am that Wesley was not violently targeted, I am sorry to report that we have seen too much vandalism lately. Our wonderfully strong "mail safe" kept our mail from being stolen, but vandals tried so hard to pick the lock that they broke it. Vandals also kicked in a window in one of the doors on the west side of the building. Trustees have fixed the window and have obtained a Post Office box for our mail, but please keep the church property and our Trustees in your prayers. (The PO box number is 6577, and the zip code has changed to 93386).

PLEASE HELP! Marv Davisson has been the chair of Finance Committee for as long as I have been pastor at Wesley and probably longer. He has many other duties and is hoping to give this job up next year. Thus Wesley needs a new Finance Committee chair. The chairperson calls the committee together to meet about once a quarter. He or she needs to be able to read and interpret the reports made by our accountant

and report to the Administrative Council. Marv is willing to train the new volunteer to do the job well. The new chair will not hold office until January 2022, but I want to identify a qualified person as soon as possible so effective training can be completed before the person steps into the job. These are the qualifications: ability to understand the process of making a budget with the committee's help. Discipleship Ministries of the UMC adds these qualifications: "The chair of finance needs a strong understanding of biblical stewardship and management of all that God provides. Basic skill with financial matters is helpful and can be supplemented by skills of others on the committee. Useful skills and experience for this position are the ability to listen to and communicate with people of all ages; skills and interest in financial budgetary matters; a passion for financially supporting the mission of making Christian disciples for the transformation of the world; and the ability to work with individuals and ministry teams." I ask that we **all** pray for God to lead the person with these qualifications to step forward, and for the Committee on Nominations and Lay Leadership to have discernment for selecting the right candidate.
