We continue to have hybrid worship, and more people seem to be showing up in the sanctuary to worship in person. I find that encouraging, and yet I haven't completely figured out the post-COVID new normal. I had hoped we would wear masks at least while singing, but it has been so very hot that mask wearing is difficult. I will continue to wear my mask as often as possible, and I suggest that for all vaccinated people, but those still unvaccinated should be masked for their safety as well as others. That said, there will be no judgement for the choices we have made.

As I mentioned in worship last Sunday, I attended a meeting last Thursday called "Active Shooter Training for Religious Institutions." A rather grim subject that hopefully will never be necessary in Wesley. The presenter was part of Homeland Security, and they are willing to do assessments for free for all religious institutions to point out ways of keeping people safe. As I said, I believe Wesley is very safe, but it is good to be aware and cautious. The places most often targeted are Mosques and Synagogues, so I want to keep such places in our prayers and I would like us to be a place of support should violence occur in the places our brothers and sisters worship. We are indeed our sibling's guardians.

The Growing Young Cohort is coming to an end at Wesley. We have one more webinar on July 24. Because of COVID, we have not had a lot of outreach in schools and other places young people frequent, but I hope we can all keep that in mind now and in the future. Focus on young families is good for the whole church. Please keep this in your prayers. I have said more than once that making disciples in more than growing the church. Making disciples is about transforming the world, leading us all toward God's kingdom.

Our Tuesday morning Bible study group is no longer meeting, so I would like to start a new group. I propose a Wednesday evening class—perhaps at 5:30—to meet in The Gathering Place. I would like to start the first week in August with a class on the Sermon on the Mount: A Beginner's Guide to the Kingdom of Heaven, by Amy-Jill Levine. It is a 6-week study, and I will be away on vacation beginning September 14, so beginning the first week of August will mean we will not have to break and re-start. Please let me know if you're interested but the time doesn't work for you. We will be flexible to try to include all who are interested! We can have a hybrid meeting both inperson and on Zoom if you're interested.
