A Note from the Pastor

Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee, and John baptized him in the Jordan River. While he was coming up out of the water, Jesus saw heaven splitting open and the Spirit, like a dove, coming down on him. ... At once the Spirit forced Jesus out into the wilderness. He was in the wilderness for forty days, tempted by Satan. He was among the wild animals, and the angels took care of him.—Mark 1: selected verses

We are in the middle of Lent. What exactly is Lent? It isn't Biblical... or is it? Lent is a season of reflection and preparation for Easter. It is a remembrance of the forty days Jesus wandered in the wilderness after his baptism, so it is traditionally marked by fasting. In the early church, and continued by the Roman Catholic and Orthodox Churches, fasting is prescribed by the church, most notably fasting from certain foods. Most Protestant churches have fewer mandates, but we are all called to dedicate some time during this season to contemplate death, especially Jesus' death on a cross and what that means for our faith journey. In the 20th and 21st centuries, many people avoid thinking and talking about temptation and death and sin, much to our detriment. Avoidance of a subject contributes to our fears. But, as another pastor put it, "Without Good Friday, Easter is just a happy party ... [and] Good Friday without Easter is just a funeral." I am not the first to say that this has been a difficult year for all of us. We long for Easter to move us out of a year-long season of doing without many of the activities we call "normal." Easter is coming! But, don't forget, Easter changes everything. Look forward with hope, and remember, "hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us," (Romans 5:5).

One of the hopes we all share is that we will soon be able to return to worshipping in the sanctuary together. I am often asked when that will happen, and I want you to know I, too, look forward to that day. But Kern County remains in the "purple zone," and our Bishop rightfully has called us to be cautious, keeping the health and safety of our community a high priority. I am working on a written protocol that needs to be approved by our District Superintendent before we can even consider reopening. Once we do return, we will not be able to sing or recite prayers or liturgies together. We will be masked, and we will not be able to use paper bulletins or collection plates or other "normal" ways of the past. So I ask you to please continue to stay in touch with each other as best you can. I invite you to online worship, prayer times and study. I also invite you to include daily prayer, devotion and Bible reading through Lent and beyond. Our "new normal" will be a joyous time of hope and resurrection.
