A Note from the Pastor

I shared this report about Annual Conference Session (ACS) in church last Sunday, but I also want to share it here because we should all feel connected to Annual Conference. My report about ACS: First, the good news—Bishop Sally Dyck had a very healing presence during ACS. It was very needed in a time that is so tumultuous in our world, our country, our denomination, and in our conference. We of course heard no news about the status of Bishop Carcaño, so I would like to keep her in our prayers, but Bishop Dyck is a wonderful speaker and an accomplished bishop, and she encouraged both laity and clergy to keep on doing the jobs to which God has called us.

Second, my two favorite parts of Conference are worship and the announcement of Central Valley appointments, including my own. I am very happy and blessed to be re-appointed to Wesley for at least another year. As always, I loved worshiping with hundreds of other United Methodists every day.

Another of the highlights for me was a change in the way we are sending candidates to Jurisdictional Conference for election to Bishop. In the past we have heard speeches and gone through a really long voting process. It's not a horrible process, of course, but it's very political. This year 19 persons accepted a nomination and will spend many months, praying about and discerning their call and their readiness to do that difficult job. This period of reflection and discernment seems to me to be a more God-centered process. Some will proceed to Jurisdictional Conference, and God willing, the best will be elected there, to begin serving as Bishop in January of 2023.
