♪ A Note from the Pastor

I pray that the eyes of your heart will have enough light to see what is the hope of God's call, what is the richness of God's glorious inheritance among believers, and what is the overwhelming greatness of God's power that is working among us believers. This power is conferred by the energy of God's powerful strength.

—Ephesians 1: 18-19

I give thanks and praise to God for the ministry to the people of Bakersfield. We begin a new worship series on Sunday to think about what it means to be part of the United Methodist Church. There are many denominations of Christian churches, all of us people of God, and it is wrong to think one is better than another. That said, some people feel drawn to one denomination over another. There are many reasons for that, but probably the most common is how we were raised or what church we attended when we first came to faith. Some of you are “cradle Methodists.” I am not. My dad was not raised in any church, although his mother was raised a Lutheran. My mother was raised in the Episcopal Church because her mother left the Roman Catholic Church because of some hurt she received from a priest. My mother took my brothers and me to a Presbyterian Sunday school when we were little, but we all stopped attending when I was about 10 years old. I came to faith through prayer, but when I started to need Christian community, I was invited to church by a friend who was United Methodist. The rest, as the saying goes, is history. So what makes the United Methodist Church like other Christian churches? What makes it unique? That is what we will be talking about in the next few weeks until Advent begins on November 27. This is a timely subject as Jurisdictional Conference meets November 2-5. We will hear more about who will serve the California/Nevada Annual Conference as resident Bishop from deliberations at that Conference. We may hear more about the churches who are planning to disaffiliate from the UMC. Please keep the Western Jurisdiction and all who are suffering from the conflicts in the church in prayer during that time.

Monday, October 31 is our annual charge conference. Each local church in the denomination is called to hold a yearly meeting to celebrate the past year of ministry and plan for the upcoming year. District Superintendent (DS) David Niu will lead our meeting which begins at 5 p.m. for the whole church—I meet with the DS earlier, as does the Staff-Parish Relations Committee (SPRC). If you have any questions about that, please be sure to ask. You can contact me or Terry Gonzales. Our numbers and email addresses are in the church directory—I hope you all picked up your new directory!

Thank you for all your work in the Pumpkin Patch. A few people have done a tremendous amount of work—Carolyn Ashlock and her whole family and the Trustees, especially Dan O'Dell seem to be in the Patch doing something all the time. Several faithful volunteers serve in the Patch measuring, pricing, and welcoming customers often. Others have volunteered behind the scenes providing baked good, purchasing and preparing coats for the give-away, and numerous other chores. (I don't dare name you, because I am sure to forget to name someone who had worked hard while my back was turned. But you know who you are!) My thanks go to all of you.
