The Pumpkins Are Coming Sunday, October 9, 2022

On Sunday, October 9, 2022, the pumpkins are scheduled to arrive at noon. We will then need your help to unload pumpkins and set up the patch. We have again reached out the the local high schools to offer community service hours for the student's help with unloading. We will request that everyone wear masks and will have plenty of hand sanitizer available. The truck will most likely arrive while we are in church or shortly thereafter, so please plan to bring "pumpkin unloading clothes" to change into if needed. We will have hot dogs, chips, dessert, and water to keep up your energy. We will also need help setting up, decorating, or selling during the rest of the day as we will be selling pumpkins until 9 PM. In the past, we have even sold pumpkins during unloading.

We will not be having a Community Fun Day this year, but will continue too pass out "goodie bags' with coloring pages, stickers and candy in them. Last year, after quite a few children asked us about crayons and telling us that they didn't have any at home. My heart sank. I just couldn't imagine not having a crayon at home as I remember vividly that big shoebox full of crayons, broken, missing wrappers and having no points, that was always there for us kids growing up. Anyway, this year we would like to provide the small packages of 3-4 crayons with the goodie bags as well. We will be having the Adopt a Pumpkin Tree again this year. So, the cash donations will also go toward buying crayons as well. The tree will have pumpkins to adopt for items needed for unloading day as well as our goodie bags.

Another successful adventure from last year was having bakery items for sale at checkout. The community remembers that we have awesome bakers at Wesley. Having cookies, cupcakes, brownies, Rice Krispie treats at checkout was a huge success. So, we will again be accepting your donations of such throughout the days of our sale to help contribute to our success. Again, the coat give away was a huge success. We attracted more business by hanging the coats on the fence and were able to bless many needy folks last year. Please clean out your closets, shop the thrift stores, or make cash donations and we'll buy them for you.
