We have been hearing a lot from the book of Genesis lately as we journey through our discipleship series. Genesis is a book filled with wonderful stories, like the one above about the younger of Isaac's sons setting out as Jacob and returning home as Israel. Rev. Alice spoke eloquently about that last Sunday. Our travels can transform us in many ways. In the last Outlook I was looking forward to my family vacation, and today I am in the midst of it. Just as Abram and his grandson Israel were transformed, so have I been, although a lot less dramatically. But I have been so blessed here; by family, by relaxation, and mostly by the goodness and beauty of God's wonderful creation. To quote from Genesis once again: "God saw everything he had made: it was supremely good," (Genesis 1:31).

I am reading a lot on vacation, and one of my current books is Beating Guns: Hope for People Who Are Weary of Violence. It was written by Shane Claiborne, an Evangelical Christian pastor who has worked for years as an activist trying to end violence in his Philadelphia neighborhood, and Michael Martin, a pastor in the Mennonite tradition who has begun to turn guns into garden tools. (They will beat their swords into iron plows and their spears into pruning tools. Nation will not take up sword against nation; they will no longer learn how to make war~ Micah 4:3). It is very interesting and I highly recommend it, but so far it has been talking mostly about American's obsession with guns. I am just getting to the part about what people of faith can do to help our nation become less violent. I hope there is something we can do to help our country become a nation of peace.

Before I left for vacation I posted an article on the bulletin board either from the Conference Center or from the Western Jurisdiction, I don't remember which, about Bishop Carcaño's upcoming trial. It was planned for August 21-25, but I learned this week that the venue has been moved to the North Central Jurisdiction, and the trial will begin on September 19. Please continue to keep this matter and all involved in your prayers.

Monday and Tuesday, August 14 and 15 is a Worship Design Studio webinar sponsored by our conference. I have signed up to attend, and it is open to all, but I am not sure if registration is still open or not.
