We continue to seek donations to help pay for the fence, and we also have the opportunity to make donations to the Bakersfield Burrito Project through our church. Please clearly mark any special donations.

Jennifer Armantrout has requested that Wesley reestablish the mission project called "Prayers and Squares." She used to be part of a larger Prayers and Squares group, but since Louise Clay's passing, Jennifer is the last one supporting this ministry at Wesley. It is a lovely project creating lap-size quilts for people in need of prayer, comfort and support. Instead of machine quilting, the layers of fabric are bound together with a tie. Once the quilt is almost complete, it is brought to church to be tied. Congregants are encouraged to take a moment during the worship service to tie a knot on the quilt while offering a prayer for the recipient.
