A Note from the Pastor

Look! I'm doing a new thing; now it sprouts up; don't you recognize it? I'm making a way in the desert, paths in the wilderness. ~~Isaiah 43: 19 (Theme for ACS)

Summertime is almost upon us, and thus, so is the Annual Conference Session (ACS). As you may know, the clergy and lay representatives from each church meet on an annual basis to hear reports on the ministry in the Conference, to plan ministry for the coming year, and to do Christian Conferencing together. Our conference covers Northern California and Northern Nevada. A partial map of the area is available here: https://www.cnumc.org/district-offices, but the areas to the north, east, and south have been truncated from this map. Bakersfield is almost the southernmost city in the Conference, but two churches in the Kern Circuit are south of Bakersfield; Tehachapi and New Cuyama. The northern edge of the Conference stretches to the northern borders of both states. Needless to say, there is a great diversity in these places. Mountains, valleys, cities, farmland, and deserts create a vast diversity of lifestyles and opinions. We must come together to discuss and discern God's call for us in this time and each place. Of course, worship is a central element of our gatherings, and at each of the worship services an offering is taken. This year the three offerings will be for Ministerial education fund (at Ordination service), necessitous grant fund (at Memorial service), and for Native American Ministries (at Sunday's worship service.) If you wish to make a contribution to any or all of these funds through Wesley, please mark you check or offering envelope clearly.

This year we will meet from June 15-18 in Sacramento. That causes a bit of a conundrum regarding worship in Bakersfield Wesley UMC because Alice and I attend as clergy, Linda R. and Bill attend as lay representatives, and Nick and Lisa will be attending their daughter Kelly's college graduation at the same time. Bishop Dyck and the ACS team encourage all churches to live-stream the ACS worship service, which you may do so from home. It will be available at cnumc.org. I hope you will be able to gather together at church to view as community but because several key members of our tech team will be in Sacramento, we are not yet ready to promise that the service will be streamed at Wesley. I am reluctant to close the sanctuary doors any Sunday, (I have memories of pandemic) but at this moment, that is a possibility. Please stay tuned as we discern possibilities.

One of the main tasks this year will be to hear reports on the request of six churches in our Conference seeking disaffiliation from the United Methodist Church. This will definitely be a time of grieving. One of the churches is in Kern County. Weldon is a small church in the mountains, and has felt separated from United Methodism for some time. My prayer is that once this season of turmoil is over, God's healing blessing will be with disaffiliating churches as well as the whole United Methodist denomination. But one of the exciting moments for me is when the Bishop and District Superintendent David Niu announces appointments, and I am officially called to serve Wesley in the coming year.
