We will continue to pass out "goodie bags' with coloring pages, stickers and candy in them and have the Adopt a Pumpkin Tree again this year. The tree will have pumpkins to adopt for items needed for unloading day as well as our goodie bags.

Another successful adventure from last year was having bakery items for sale at checkout. The community remembers that we have awesome bakers at Wesley. Having cookies, cupcakes, brownies, Rice Krispie treats at checkout was a huge success. So, we will again be accepting your donations of such throughout the days of our sale to help contribute to our success. Again, the coat give away was a huge success. We attracted more business by hanging the coats on the fence and were able to bless many needy folks last year. Please clean out your closets, shop the thrift stores, or make cash donations and we'll buy them for you.

The season of pumpkins is fast approaching! Hopefully there is more information in this newsletter about ways you can help, but just in case, please mark your calendars on October 8 for the arrival of this year's truckload of pumpkins. There are many ways to help with both the fundraising effort as well as a way we reach out to our neighbors. High school students will help on unloading day, and we will need to feed them. Look for the "pumpkin tree" in the narthex that will give opportunities to contribute to that luncheon, and keep in mind out annual coat giveaway and bake sale.

This morning I am a little giddy because I just listened to a podcast starring—me! Actually, I was the first person interviewed by Ian Tash, a young, post-graduate theology student at CSUB. If you did enter your name on the sign-up sheet in the Narthex, please know that either Edee or I will contact you soon to let you know more details. The church will order the books, and the total cost will be divided among the participants so the price each person pays will be equitable. They are workbooks, so everyone will need their own copy.

You were all invited to check the draft that was posted in the narthex for several weeks, so hopefully everyone's information will be up to date.
