♪ A Note from the Pastor


And there was a voice from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I dearly love; in you I find happiness." At once the Spirit forced Jesus out into the wilderness. He was in the wilderness for forty days, tempted by Satan. He was among the wild animals, and the angels took care of him. ~ Mark 1: 11-13

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent, which celebrates the time Jesus spent in the wilderness at the beginning of his ministry. By the time you have received this edition of The Outlook, we will be well within the first week of Lent, a season we remember every year. When I read the scripture from Mark today, I noticed two things—that Jesus' wilderness wandering occurred as God's blessing was still reverberating in his ears, and that the angels took care of him during the whole time. Of course I have read these facts before, but today I found them remarkable because we think of wilderness wandering as a time of temptation and deprivation, but it was also a time of great blessing. God was with Jesus always, and God is always with us, despite our feelings of abandonment.

One of Wesley's events during Lent is "Coins for Lent." This is a fun way to collect a special offering for missions. We count our belongings and put a coin of any denomination in the collection. I started mine early because I will be away for the first week in Lent (more on that in a moment) and I discovered that one of those days, we count the candles in our home. I don't think I can count that high! It is probably fewer than one hundred, so I just put in a dollar bill. The money will be sent to United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) to be used for relief to Ukraine.

I will be away on vacation from February 15 through the 23rd. Shawn Collins will preach on the first Sunday in Lent, and I will be back for the second. It is 8-days away, but one of them is President's Day, so it counts as a week. I won't be taking phone calls, but I will check my text messages in the evenings. I hope to return relaxed and ready for this very busy season.
