Ash Wednesday Service February 14, 2024, 4:15 p.m., Wesley Sanctuary

Meditation: "There Your Heart Will Be" Scriptures: Joel 2: 1-2, 12-17; Psalm 51: 1-7 and Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, the forty days prior to Easter Day. Lent is a time of reflection, repentance and remembrance of the final weeks of the life of Jesus and his sacrifice. The name Ash Wednesday comes from the tradition of marking the forehead of people with ashes to symbolize mourning and repentance. Join us in the sanctuary for worship, including the traditional imposition of ashes.

A Note from the Pastor

Jesus returned from the Jordan River full of the Holy Spirit and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness. There he was tempted for forty days by the devil. He ate nothing during those days and afterward Jesus was starving. ~Luke 4: 1-2

I was an adult when I learned that Mardi Gras meant "Fat Tuesday." I thought it was just the name for a rowdy party held in New Orleans. (You can probably tell I did not take French in school!) Mardi Gras is called that because people feast on the day before Lent begins to get rid of all the rich foods they have in their houses so they can follow the tradition of fasting during the forty days of Lent that begins on Ash Wednesday. This year Ash Wednesday is celebrated on February 14, and this year our service will begin at 4:15 pm. The time was chosen to accommodate the Disciple Class that finishes their study at 4 pm and choir that gathers at 6:15. It is also a good time for folks who hesitate to drive after dark, because the sun will set at 5:37 that day, so it should be light until about 6 p.m. So please mark your calendars for the service. It will be a traditional service with the imposition of ashes.

In United Methodist tradition, Lent may be observed by fasting or by adopting a new discipline that helps you feel closer to God. That was how Wesley's mid-day prayer group got started, but here we are almost four years later continuing to meet five days per week to pray together. Our disciplines can last a lot longer than 40 days! Perhaps you would like to take on a new ministry, like visiting people to pray with them. Last year, Discipleship Ministries of the UMC created a Lenten calendar that suggested monetary donations each day, based upon how blessed we are by abundance. For example, you would set aside a coin (any denomination) for every can of soup you have in your house. At the end of the 40-days, there is enough for a good donation to a very good cause. Discipleship Ministries has created another such calendar, and I invite you to join in this collection! This year we will support United Methodist Committee on Relief. I would like to earmark our contribution for relief to Ukraine, but I am open to your suggestions.

I will be away the first Sunday in Lent. My brother Robert has invited me to celebrate his granddaughter's birthday in Hawaii, and he is paying my way! That is an offer I could not refuse. But I will be gone just over one week. Exact dates to follow in the next Outlook—since Robert is buying my ticket to suit his schedule, I do not yet have exact dates and times.
