

₽ A Note from the Pastor

You were made rich through [Christ] in everything: in all your communication and every kind of knowledge, in the same way that the testimony about Christ was confirmed with you. The result is that you aren't missing any spiritual gift while you wait for our Lord Jesus Christ to be revealed. 1 Corinthians 1: 5-8

There is one dedicated pre-teen in our church who has accepted the challenge to take confirmation class. I need others to join him! I mentioned in worship that I have purchased material that is intended to help young people confirm the promises made at their baptism. According to the teaching materials, confirmation is more than a decision, "it is the beginning of a conversation about what it means to be a Christian, live out your faith, your commitment, and God's call." It is a journey meant to be made in community. In order to be successful, each young person will need a mentor. That person must be committed to journey alongside the youth, but need not be a "perfect Christian," just someone who will learn with them. Right now, the plan is to meet right after church, perhaps

at church or at a place comfortable for the youth. Please let me know as soon as possible if you are a young person between the ages of 12 and 30 who wants to learn more about faith development or if you know someone who fits that description, or if you are willing to mentor such a person. Ideally, this should be a group of 8-12 individuals, adults and youth, but if there are more people interested, we can form two groups. There are books for confirmands and mentors. The church will provide the material, but I need to know how much to order.

A few months ago Douglas Carothers began leading our choir. He is eager to lead and encourage us. He has purchased music that is perfect for a small choir, but I know he would be pleased to help the choir grow. You need not be a professional-quality singer, you need only want to praise God! Choir meets Wednesdays at 6:15 and Sunday mornings before church. That said, we have planned Music Sunday for May 5. You may participate in that, with your voice or any other instrument, but please let Doug know. You can contact him at douglas@whatsdougdoing.com.

As announced in church, I have reached the age of mandatory retirement, but the Bishop and the cabinet have agreed to reappointment me to Wesley one more year. There will be a retirement celebration at Annual Conference this year. I don't yet know which day, but our Conference meets in Sacramento June 7-10. Anyone interested can attend as a guest.
