△ A Note from the Pastor

Then God said, "Let us make humans in our image, according to our likeness, and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over the cattle and over all the wild animals of the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth." So God created humans in his image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. Genesis 1: 26-27

The big news, at least in my life, is that General Conference 2020 begins just a little over three hours from the moment I am writing this! Conference was delayed over four years, first by the pandemic and then by myriad other problems. The delegates meet daily, except for Sunday, from April 23 through May 4. There are 1,099 petitions before the conference this year. According to our two "first delegates," Rev. Dr. Kah-Jin Jeffrey Kuan and Conference Lay Leader Micheal Pope, the most important legislation the delegates have been working on for the last five years are "Three R's." The Removal of any language that harms and divides the people of the United Methodist Church, especially around racism and gender or human sexuality issues. The second "R" is the Revision of the Social Principles. The third "R" is Regionalization, a creating a pathway for the church to go forward together into the future. Nick Strobel has graciously posted a link to watch the proceedings on Wesley's homepage. Please pray for the successful work of this conference and for the discernment of all the delegates.

Doug Carothers has been working hard to put together a fine program for worship on "Music Sunday," May 5. The choir will have two anthems, and there will be several special pieces from talented musicians within the congregation. Please do your best to attend. Although all participants use their talents to praise God, these talented performers deserve an appreciative human audience!

Two Sunday's ago I promised to share one or two creation justice tips in every edition of The Outlook to help us become more faithful stewards of God's creation. Plastic has become so ubiquitous in the world that we even breathe it into our bodies. I quote anthropologist Margaret Mead, "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful committed individuals can change the world; indeed, it's the only thing that ever has." I have signed up for a monthly newsletter from our friends at Creation Justice Ministries. Here are a few tips from their April newsletter: "Treat your family to alternatives to the usual single-use plastic items in your home. Consider bamboo toothbrushes, shampoo bars, aluminum water bottles, reusable silicone baggies, for example. Or visit a refill store. Move away from "throw-away." Personally, I buy a number of household products from a company called Grove. They sell earth-friendly products without plastic packaging. Their paper products are made from bamboo rather than trees. If you allow me to help you sign you up with them, we can save money together.
